Timothy Brown was Director of Music at Oundle School from 1973 until 1979 when he succeeded John Rutter as Director of Music at Clare College. In 1971 the Choir became the first Oxbridge college choir to feature female sopranos and altos; a European reputation was confirmed when it won Gran Premio at the Arezzo International Singing Competition in 1983 and further visits to Italy, Belgium and France have since been undertaken. The latest of the Choir's five records under Timothy Brown includes one of Byrd's Christmas motets and Peter Maxwell Davies's 'O Magnum Mysterium'.

A specialist in early music performance techniques, Jacques van Oortmerssen succeeded Gustav Leonhardt as Organist of the Waalse Kerk in Amsterdam where the organ built by Muller dates from 1734. He is also Professor of Organ at the Sweelinck Conservatoire in Amsterdam and a visiting Professor at Gothenburg University. His recordings on historical Dutch organs are widely known, especially in Japan. This programme will be played on a portable organ made by Richard Bower.
