Oundle School, founded in 1556, is one of Britain's leading Independent Schools. Sited around a market town of areat character, the School has lovely buildings and grounds. Oundle has just benefited areatly from the opening of a bypass. In addition to the Chapel, the Organ Week will use the School's new Stahl Theatre and Great Hall: there will also be concerts in nearby Elton Hall, Fotheringhay Church and Stoke Doyle Church. The School's refurbished Tuckshop will serve as a Festival Club, giving students the chance to socialise, meet artists and browse through exhibitions.

SUMMER SCHOOL

Summer School students accepted for the Week will be enrolled for one of four courses. They will also have the opportunity to learn through listening: 2nd O.I.O.W's Festival Events feature an attractive series of concerts by well-known artists.

courses

BUILDING A REPERTOIRE - A (likely age range 14-17)

A course to encourage students in the earlier stages of technique and repertoire development.

Students should benefit enormously from the experience and charisma of O.I.O.W.'s distinguished Tutors, John Wellingham, Kimberly Marshall, Albert Richenhagen and James Parsons will feature prominently in their programme. The opportunity to explore a number of fine organs outside Oundle should be particularly attractive.

PREPARING FOR UNIVERSITY OR MUSIC COLLEGE (likely age range 15 - 18)

A course to broaden horizons and stimulate progress for those considering organ studies on leaving school — of particular value to potential University Organ Scholars.

In sessions which focus especially upon the requirements for Oxbridge Organ Scholarship trials, students will be coached by the Summer School Tutors in various aspects of repertoire and, more generally, by leading musicians in Oxford and Cambridge. There will also be some instruction in basic choir training.

BUILDING A REPERTOIRE - B (likely age range 16 — 19)

A course to extend technique and stylistic awareness for moderately advanced students.

Students will be taught in seminars and master-classes by all the Summer School Tutors. Of great appeal should be classes by Jacques van Oortmerssen, which aim to introduce aspects of early keyboard technique and sessions by Martin Haselböck on the organ music of Mozart and Liszt.

ADVANCED ACADEMY

for organists up to and including age 22

Students accepted will receive master-class tuition in

- 'Sweelinck to Stanley' an exploration of authentic performance techniques (Jacques van Oortmerssen)
- (Nicholas Danby) - 18th century German repertory
- French organ literature of the Grand Siècle (Donald Sutherland)
- The interpretation of Franz Liszt (Martin Haselböck) - Marcel Dupré and the modern French School (Kimberly Marshall)

Each course will incorporate excursions and study visits outside Oundle.

awards

On Saturday 26 July, a Platform Concert will give selected students the opportunity to perform on the Frobenius organ to an influential audience. At this event, a number of Awards will be made. Details of these will be announced later but will include

- recital engagements
- study opportunities
- prizes of music, money etc.

- Organs in Cambridge, Oxford, Northampton and Nottingham built by von Beckerath, Church, Frobenius, Grant Degens and Bradbeer, Marcussen, Rieger, Walker
