OUNDLE INTERNATIONAL ORGAN WEEK -PERFECT PLANNING A MENSIS MIRABILIS IN THE ORGAN WORLD!

July 1987 is to be a mensis mirabilis in the organ world. Third Oundle International Organ Week occupies the seven days between the St Albans International Organ Festival (4-11 July) and the once-every-decade International Congress of Organists in Cambridge (19-26 July).

The 1987 Oundle Week has broadened its appeal. Organists and organ buffs will relish the varied programmes, with return visits from Kimberly Marshall and Jacques van Oortmerssen. Both Lionel Rogg and Anne Page will be going on to Cambridge to participate in the ICO; Timothy Albrecht and Colin Andrews will give fascinating programmes of American and British twentieth century music.

Lovers of chamber music will welcome the variety of concerts on offer: these include performances by pre-eminent wind soloists Michael Collins and Michala Petri, guitarist Anthea Gifford, who appears with members of the Delmé Quartet, and, for your unabashed entertainment, a presentation The Great

Fotheringhay Church, an inspiring venue in previous years, plays host to the Scottish Early Music Consort in a programme featuring music of the time of Mary, Queen of Scots; it was four hundred years ago this February that the 'unfortunate queen' was executed at Fotheringhay Castle.

Sir Alexander Gibson, one of the great contributors to music in Scotland since the war, conducts the English Chamber Orchestra in a concert that ends with Mendelssohn's Scottish Symphony and which shows the enterprise of O.I.O.W. in the première of Organ Concerto by Derek Bourgeois.

The Third Oundle International Organ Week presents an exciting series of concerts to cater for varied musical tastes. An essential component, as before, is the concurrent Summer School for Young Organists. The skills and enthusiasm of these young musicians underpin the whole event and audiences will do well to end the Week at the Platform Concert to witness the wealth of talent attracted to Oundle. July in Oundle will be fun!

HOW TO FIND OUNDLE

Oundle is a beautiful old market town, built in the local stone and sited in the rolling landscape of the Nene Valley in East Northamptonshire. The town is about 14 miles south west of Peterborough on the A605 and there is an excellent train service to Peterborough from King's Cross Station and from the North. Oundle is only 35 miles (45 minutes by car) from Cambridge and is easily reached by road from Northampton, Bedford and Leicester. Indeed it is easily accessible anywhere from the Midlands. Last year a by-pass to the town was opened, which has made it considerably quieter. A range of agreeable accommodation – hotels, guest houses, bed and breakfasts, self-catering cottages – is available in the area. This part of England is little-known and its charms await discovery!


