But it is not 'organ organ all the time'! On Tuesday, the Frobenius can be heard with Chetham's Orchestra, from Britain's premier specialist music school; midst the art exhibits at the Yarrow, Renaissance and Restoration consort music; piano virtuosi Anthony Goldstone and Caroline Clemmow perform in the Stahl Theatre whilst Fotheringhay Church provides an inspiring setting for Baroque ensemble *Musica Donum Dei* on Friday. To complete the festival atmosphere, there is family entertainment in the form of a Rally of Street Organs with stalls, sideshows and dancing displays, all over Oundle on Saturday - and the Festival Club!

'This will prove a brave kingdom to me, where I shall have my music for nothing' remarks Stephano in *The Tempest*.
