PETER HURFORD

Returning to Oundle for the third time. Donald Sutherland is a lively. popular communicator and students will find him an enthusiastic and brilliant exponent of contemporary and avant-garde music. An exciting recitalist, a member of the organ faculty of the Peabody Conservatory of Music in Baltimore, and Director of Music at Bradley Hills Presbyterian Church, Maryland, Donald Sutherland is superbly well-qualified to inspire organists of every ability.

One of the most distinguished interpreters of that neglected repertoire, English Romantic organ music. Roger Fisher has been organist of Chester Cathedral since 1967. Conductor of the 1990 Festival Choir at Oundle, Simon Lawford began his musical career as a chorister at St Paul's Cathedral. After winning an organ scholarship to Magdalen College, Oxford, he was assistant organist at Peterborough Cathedral, then at Christ Church, Oxford. Since last autumn he has been organist to the Choeur de la Maîtrise Nationale de Versailles.
