In common with her brother, her career encompasses many styles of music, from jazz to musical theatre, oratorio to opera. She has appeared in Carmen Jones, Porgy and Bess, Jonathan Miller's The Tempest and the RSC's productions of Kiss Me Kate and Showboat. Melanie also performs with the Cambridge Singers and has appeared on TV, most notably in the recording of Michael Tippet's New Year.
