

The music during today's service will be performed by the Festival Choir specially formed from members of the summer school and local residents, and conducted by Timothy Brown. It will commemorate the tercentary of the death of Henry Purcell in 1695.

The choir's founder and conductor, Timothy Brown, is Director

of Music at Clare College, Cambridge, and former Director of Music at Oundle School. He directs both Clare College Choir and Cambridge University Chamber Choir, taking both on extensive tours and making regular recordings. Clare College Choir also broadcasts regularly on the BBC and gives frequent concerts at Festivals both in Europe and

the UK. As a freelance choral conductor, Timothy Brown is well-known in Europe and the USA, and later this year will take part in the 17th Zimriya (World Assembly of Choirs) in Jerusalem.

Henry Purcell T (1659-1695) n

The Officiant at today's Mattins is The Revd David Jarmy, a non-stipendiary priest in the parish of Oundle since 1990. David Jarmy grew up in and around Leicester, where he was taught singing at the university and participated in a variety of musical activities, including oratorio, choral and early music. After ordination training at Chichester, he served in three parishes in Sussex, where he was involved in relating music to the needs of the liturgy. He has worked with several composers and musicians in seminars and workshops on liturgical music.

He is now Chaplain and head of Religous Education at Bishop Stopford School in Kettering.
