

## Community Events

The **Oundle Artists Group** is holding an Exhibition of drawings, paintings and prints in the Yarrow Art Gallery, beginning on Saturday 8 July and continuing every day until Sunday 23 July. The works on display are by local established artists, and the exhibition is open from 1 pm to 6 pm every day.

Several community events take place to coincide with the first weekend of the Festival. The **Horticultural Society** annual show is on Saturday and Sunday, 15th/16th July in Oundle School Great Hall, and well worth a visit to see the amazing fruit and vegetables, and beautiful flower displays. Many other classes include baking, handicrafts and photography. Open Saturday from 2.30 pm to 6 pm and Sunday 2 pm to 5 pm. Light refreshments will be available.

Also on Saturday 15th, the **Home Farm Trust** annual fete is once more on the Home Close in Glapthorn Road, providing a day out for all the family. At the same time you can see the start of the **Oundle Road Runners Fun Run**; it begins at 2.30 pm and is to be run over approximately two miles. The organisers are keen to stimulate interest in young people and are hoping to receive lots of entries. All finishers will receive a medal, and there will be trophies for the winners.

There is to be a tour of **Oundle on Foot** on Thursday 20 July, to coincide with Market Day and the traditional Festival lunchtime recital in the Parish Church, this year given by students of the Paris Conservatoire. A light lunch is available in the Festival Club in Milton Road so you can make it a pleasant day out in Oundle. Further details are given on page 17.
