Summer School Tutors

Many of the internationally renowned tutors who take part in the Oundle International Summer School for Young Organists also give a public performance, and are listed elsewhere in this programme. However, the busy schedule of the summer school and festival does not allow every tutor to give a recital; the following have also contributed significantly to the students' tutorial programme:

David Saint - is organist and director of music at St Chad's Cathedral in Birmingham, and also head of organ studies at the Birmingham Conservatoire. Well known as a recitalist, he was also organist for the wedding of Lizzie and Nigel in *The Archers*.

James Thomas - Now director of music at Kingston Grammar School, James Thomas is also organist at the Church of St Mary the Virgin, Bourne Street, London. He is assistant course director to the OIF Summer School.

Simon Williams - is education and development officer at the Royal College of Organists. Through his teaching he has helped many young organistss on their way to musical success. As assistant organist at St George's Church, Hanover Square, he has played frequently for live BBC Radio 3 broadcasts of choral evensong.

Robert Costin - A former music scholar at Oundle School, Robert spent two years as assistant organist at Wellington and Auckland Cathedrals in New Zealand before returning to this country to take up a post as assistant organist at Blackburn Cathedral. He is now assistant director of music at Worksop College.
