The Sound of Oundle

The inspired collage which graces our cover reflects the essence of this year's Festival; interposed elements make an appealing pattern in which classical music 'furnished with a Russian soul' contrasts with works by Bach and Messiaen, two composers whose inspiring works offer a spiritual dimension to our busy lives. Earthbound Heaven Sent, the title of the art exhibition at the Yarrow Gallery, sums it up nicely.

We are honoured that Simon Preston and Dame Gillian Weir, two of the brightest luminaries amongst today's great organists, have agreed to become new Honorary Patrons of the Festival.

Oundle's unique feature has always been the international summer school for young organists; we remain wedded to their cause. Demand for places grows year by year. This time, 55 determined and talented students have been selected from some 80 who applied, and this at a moment when a dearth of interest in the organ is frequently reported by the media. Last autumn, nearly 70% of those gaining organ scholarships at Oxford and Cambridge had attended our courses.

For organists, 'The Old and New Testaments' of the repertoire are enshrined in the works of Bach and Messiaen, who would have been 90 this year. To introduce them in recital, masterclass and lecture, we have some of the greatest names: Bach specialists Jacques van Oortmerssen and Peter Williams and, for Messiaen, no less than the organiste titulaire of Notre Dame, Olivier Latry, and his Parisian colleague Susan Landale. In a distinguished diapason of organ recitals we also present Thomas Trotter, Colin Andrews and Janette Fishell, offering ambient literature from the baroque, romantic and modern periods. As an innovation, Michael Gailit plays Reubke's piano sonata and organ sonata in the same programme.

Why not ask at the Festival Club for details of the organ classes, so that you may attend some sessions as an observer? The whole Festival concludes with a recital given by the organ students themselves.

Beyond the organ loft, instrumental music by Bach and Messiaen occupies a special place at our four twilight recitals, dedicated to all six of Bach's Suites for solo cello, and Messiaen's Quartet for the End of Time. These events provide a platform for brilliant young artists and use fascinating venues.

The technical prowess and passionate intensity of Russian musicians is legendary; hear for yourself! Our prominent Russian theme abuts the world of Bach in Nikolai Demidenko's piano recital; spellbinding transcriptions of Bach organ pieces complement Mussorgsky's *Pictures*. And then, two leading ensembles, Peresvet Choir, and the Rimsky-Korsakov Quartet, from Moscow and St Petersburg respectively, make their UK debut in Oundle. For a glimpse of the arid earth in which, under the Soviets, Russian artists had to survive, listen to Irina Ratushinskaya, imprisoned for writing poetry, reading from her work on Thursday lunchtime.

Celebrity appearances by percussionist Evelyn Glennie, Humphrey Lyttelton, Elaine Delmar and the BBC Big Band complete the exciting line up. Dance to Humph's music in our established jazz and fireworks formula on the Poplars Field: *I Got Rhythm* is our theme.

The continued support (for three years now) of our principal sponsor, Barclays Stockbrokers, is enormously appreciated, as too is the generosity and fidelity of the many companies, trusts, individuals and professional bodies that underpin the Sound of Oundle. As ever, Oundle School's sponsorship is simply invaluable. The measure of support that the Festival now receives imparts confidence both to ourselves and to sponsors. We look forward to giving all such an even higher profile in the future as our activities develop. Next November, in association with Cambridge Summer Recitals and King's College, we shall promote, in a series of prestigious Cambridge recitals, Hommage à Messiaen. Our country house concert at Christmas, and Pulling out the Stops for beginner organists next Spring, together with plans for new organs, are all objectives on the exciting road ahead.
