Timetable:

During the weekend students will enjoy inspiring teaching sessions in small groups, using the five excellent organs available at Oundle. On the Saturday everyone will attend the recital at King's College Chapel (see panel above), followed by an organ crawl to try out several of the Cambridge college organs. Sunday, after more lessons, there will be an informal afternoon concert given by the students themselves: they will play the splendid Frobenius organ in Oundle School Chapel, and parents and friends are warmly invited (free admission).

Location:

Oundle is a charming market town on the A605,
12 miles west of Peterborough.

Access by road is from the A1 or A14 (A1-M1 link road).

By train, Peterborough is on the main East coast line;
we will meet trains if required.

How to apply:

- Please return your completed application form by 11 January 1999.
- Enclose a letter from your piano or organ teacher giving some information about your musical background, interests and accomplishments.
- Send no money with your application.

We will reply by 1 February to let you know whether we can offer you a place on the course.
