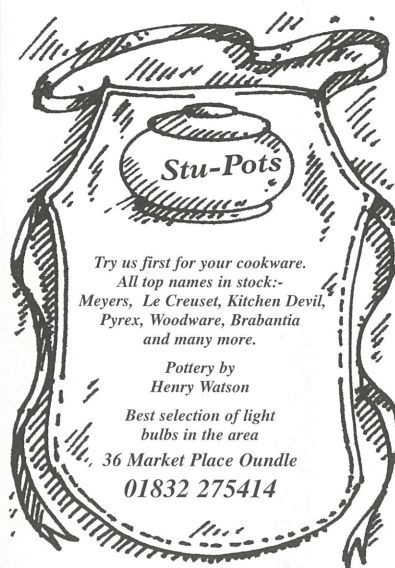

Ralph Allwood**

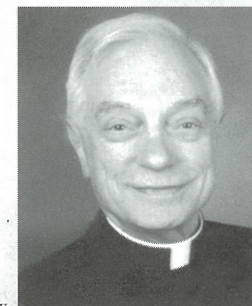
Ralph Allwood is Precentor and Director of Music at Eton College; he directs the four week long Eton Choral Courses which he founded in 1980. Having just completed a three year stint as Director of the National Youth Choir of Wales, he teaches choral conducting for the Hereford Summer Schools and the Voices Foundation Symposium. Ralph Allwood has worked with the Philharmonia Choir and has recently prepared Mahler's Symphony's No 2 for Christoph von Dohnanyi with the Bach Choir. He is a judge for the Sainsbury's Choir of the Year Competition, and regularly visits the USA to give masterclasses and workshops.

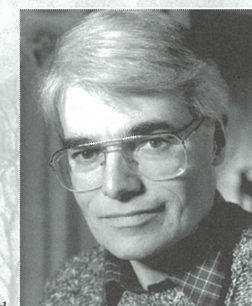
W A Mozart (1756-1791)

On 15 January 1779 Mozart returned to Salzburg after a musically abortive and domestically tragic journey to Paris with his mother. The 'Paris' symphony apart, there was little to show for it, certainly no prestigious appointment, and he had had to bury his much tried and heroic mother in Paris. In Salzburg he buckled down to church music and finished this extended mass on 23 March 1779. Its image is of the Virgin miraculously crowned, hence the name Coronation attached to the mass.

Though the orchestra for this work is no larger than that of the pre-Paris Salzburg masses, its use on equal terms with the voices lends to the longer movements the feel of a short choral symphony.
