Summer School Tutors

The organ recitals during the Festival are all performed by organists of distinction who also devote much time and energy to teaching at the Oundle Summer School for Young Organists. Their biographies are contained elsewhere in this programme. The following organists also put a great deal of energy into our teaching programme, but the packed schedule of events for the week does not allow time for them to give a recital.

James Lloyd Thomas

Assistant course director to the OIF Summer School, James Lloyd Thomas is Director of Music at Christ College, Brecon and conductor of the Dyfed choir. Until recently he was organist of St Mary's Bourne Street, London, and Director of Music at Kingston Grammar School.

Karin Nelson

Born in Skellefteä in the far north of Sweden, Karin Nelson is organist at the Haga Church and Conservatory Professor in Gothenburg. A virtuoso organist and harpsichordist commanding a comprehensive repertoire, she performs regularly with the Gothenburg Symphony Orchestra

and is a doctoral student at the University there, researching the North German tradition of organ Magnificats.

Robert Costin

Following a music scholarship to Oundle School, Robert Costin was subsequently educated at the Royal Academy of Music and Cambridge University, where he was organ

scholar of Pembroke College. After graduating he spent two years working in New Zealand at Wellington and Auckland Cathedrals before returning to become Assistant Director of Music at Blackburn Cathedral. At present, he

is Organist of Worksop College, Nottinghamshire. This year there is a new look to the Advanced Academy course which has been specifically designed for those who intend to emerge into a professional career as an organist. They will spend three days of the summer school week resident in Cambridge, with unlimited access to many of the finest College organs. As well as some members of the tutorial team in Oundle, two celebrated organists, Peter Hurford and Thomas Trotter, will each spend a day with these students in Cambridge, focusing on a particular area of study.

Peter Hurford

For twenty years Peter Hurford was Master of the Music at

St Albans Cathedral, and whilst there founded the International Organ Festival, in 1963. He directed this world famous organ competition for its first fifteen years and has done much to restore the organ to the mainstream of music. Known particularly for his interpretation of

Bach's organ music, he has twice recorded the complete works. In 1997 he performed Bach's organ works in fifteen concerts at the 50th Edinburgh International Festival.

Thomas Trotter

Appointed Birmingham City Organist in 1983 in succession to Sir George Thalben-Ball, Thomas Trotter also holds the post of organist at St Margaret's Westminster. A former organ scholar at King's College, Cambridge, he studied with Marie-Claire Alain in Paris, winning

the Prix de Virtuosité in her class. In 1979 he was first prizewinner at the St Albans International Organ Competition. Thomas Trotter tours throughout the world and is an active recording artist.

The Nicholas Danby **Scholarship**

To be awarded by the Trustees biennially to an organ student of outstanding promise for postgraduate conservatoire study outside their home tradition. The scholarship is therefore open to students from music colleges in the UK for study elsewhere in Europe, and to conservatoire students from other European countries who would like the opportunity to study in the UK. The Trust also aims to help scholarship holders in their first steps towards establishing concert careers.
