Youngsters will live at Fletton House, Oundle, a comfortable and well-equipped boarding house close to Oundle School Chapel. Facilities include games room, and pastoral care is provided by experienced staff.

During the weekend students will enjoy inspiring teaching sessions playing the fine pipe organs in and around Oundle. A special feature will be the trip to Cambridge to hear John Scott's recital in the world famous Chapel of King's College, followed by an 'organ crawl' to try out several of the organs in other college chapels. The course will end with an informal concert given by the students themselves; they will play the splendid Frobenius organ in Oundle School Chapel. This event takes place on Sunday 9 April at 2.30pm; parents and friends are warmly invited (free admission).

LOCATION

Oundle in Northamptonshire is a lovely old market town on the A605, 12 miles west of Peterborough. Access by road is from the A1M or A14.

By train, Peterborough is on the main GNER east coast line; we will meet trains if required.
