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THE TUTORS



David Saint is Organist and Director of Music at St Chad's Cathedral, Birmingham (where there is a magnificent new organ) and heads the BMus, Organ and Harpsichord departments at Birmingham Conservatoire. A former pupil of Dame Gillian Weir, he is well known as an inspiring recitalist and teacher.

Sarah Baldock is a prominent figure on today's young organists' scene. She is Assistant Organist and Director of the Girls' Choir at Winchester Cathedral and is a Council member of the RCO. In 1998 she was a finalist in the immensely influential Calgary International Organ Competition.





James Lloyd Thomas is Director of Music at Christ College, Brecon and maintains a high profile as an organist and organ teacher. Until recently Organist of St Mary's, Bourne Street, London, he has long played an important role teaching at the annual Oundle International Summer School for Young Organists.

Neil Cockburn is a young concert organist of great distinction, having won prestigious prizes at the RCO examinations and first prize in the 1996 Dublin International Organ Competition. He is a tutor at the St Giles International Organ School and Director of Music at Bromley Parish Church.





Gerdi Troskie hails from South Africa and studied music at the University of Port Elizabeth. She proceeded to advanced organ study at the Amsterdam Conservatoire and is now making her mark in London as an exciting young teacher at the Royal College of Music Junior Department.

James Parsons, formerly Director of Music at Oundle School, now devotes his time to directing Oundle International Festival, which he founded in 1985, and to his international career as an organ recitalist. He is a tutor at the St Giles International Organ School and this year has taught at three courses organised by the RCO.
