Virtuoso guitarist **Martin Taylor** first came to prominence in the late 1970's through his collaborations with violinist legend Stephane Grappelli.

Although inspired initially by the gypsy guitarist Django Reinhardt, it was to be piano players, most notably Art Tatum, that caught Martin's imagination. In 1978 he made his debut album, and the following year was invited by Stephane Grappelli to play a series of concerts in France. Followed by a coast to coast tour of the US, including Carnegie Hall and the Hollywood Bowl, this was to be the beginning of an eleven year collaboration.

In 1994 Martin formed his group **Spirit of Django** with the aim of paying homage and creating a new contemporary sound inspired by the gypsy guitar genius, Django Reinhardt. The group's first album reached No 1 in the UK Jazz Charts, and was nominated Best Album of the Year 1995 at the British Jazz Awards. Many people will have heard Martin's version of Robert Palmer's tune Johnny and Mary, which was used for the cult TV advertisement about 'Nicole and Papa', for the Renault Clio.

Humphrey Lyttelton is descended from a long line of landowning, political, military, clerical, scholastic and literary forebears. Not a musician among them. Despite this, Humph formed his first jazz band in 1948 and has never looked back. Now busier than ever, his band still tours regularly.

Every Monday night for over thirty years has found him on BBC Radio 2, purveying The Best of Jazz on record. And on Radio 4 he has played the role of reluctant chairman for over twenty-five years to the anarchic panel game 'I'm sorry I haven't a clue'.

As a freelance journalist Humphrey Lyttelton writes reviews and articles; he is also the author of seven books and has composed over 200 tunes which have been recorded by his band.
