Organists' Review

We assume, as you're already reading this, that you are interested in the organ and its music. If you have not yet placed a regular order, please read on and see what you might miss...

The Specification

First of all, there are lots of **Great** articles about organs, organists, organ music and all kinds of other subjects of interest to lovers of the organ and its music.

The Editor's mailbag continues to **Swell** with the volume of letters he receives. Some are learned, some are argumentative, some contain memories of long ago; all are thoughtful and worthwhile. The only problem is that there simply is not enough space to print all of them.

The new Education section shows that we are **Positive** in our approach to the needs of students - of any age. There are articles about technique and performance and *Janette Cooper's Helpline* answers questions from those who need advice.

The comprehensive Review section keeps readers up to date with new recordings and new music, not only in the **Solo** organ repertoire but also organ with other instruments and choral music, with or without accompaniment. This section is indispensable to readers who are building a library of organ CDs but do not have access to a record shop, and to organists and choir leaders who buy their music by mail order.

The advertisements **Echo** the current trends in organ building. Many of them are illustrated with beautiful colour pictures. The front covers alone are worth collecting.

OR does not really have a **Pedal** section, but the *IAO News*, issued free with every copy of **OR**, gives the low-down on what is going on in the IAO and its affiliated associations - reports of interesting visits and meetings, announcements of forthcoming events and news from the AGM and IAO Council.

And there's more! If you take out a subscription to **OR** and/or are an IAO member, you will be able to buy the *IAO Millennium Book* at the special price of £3 including postage and packing. This will be a softback book of over 100 pages with a dozen or more articles by Sir David Lumsden, Prof Peter Williams, Prof Thomas Murray, Stephen Bicknell and others, giving a many-faceted view of the organ world at the turn of the century. The planned publication date is May 2000; the price to the public will be £6. It will be available by mail order only.
