James L Thomas

Assistant course director to the OIF Summer School, James has held prestigious teaching and organist posts at St Mary's Bourne St, London and Christ College Brecon, amongst others. In September he is to become director of music at St Leonards-Mayfield School, with its famous May Festival.

Bine Katrine Bryndorf
