Fotheringhay today is well known as the 15th century seat of the Dukes of York, birthplace of Richard III and scene of the execution of Mary Queen of Scots in 1587. From 1415 to 1548, however, the town was dominated by the largest college of chantry priests in the realm and was one of the most impressive musical establishments in late medieval England.

As the burial place of the great

15th c. Dukes of York (Edward and Richard) it became a royal mausoleum, whilst the college and castle served as a retreat for the great and the good of English society, attracting much royal patronage. This concert provides the first modern musical narrative to the 15th and 16th century history of Fotheringhay College, and includes modern-day premieres of music composed by musicians working there in the 1530s.

Coincides with an exhibition in the Church, 5 - 21 July, to commemorate the Golden Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II and the birth of Richard III in 1452.
