



# THE JUNGUES UMMER SCHOOLS

Four courses for young organists are on offer, details below.

ENR, ST and AA will take place from 14th to 21st July in OUNDLE.

## Exploring New Repertoire (ENR)

typical age range 13 - 17

If you have taken up the organ fairly recently and have reached about grade VI standard, this very popular Oundle course offers you a tremendous boost. You will enjoy the opportunity to play, in small groups and for individual practice, many new organs in and around Oundle; there will also be visits to Cambridge and Oakham. Most of all, you will get the chance to meet others with the same interest in a friendly and non-competitive atmosphere.

## Style and Technique (ST)

typical age range 16 - 21

Here is a programme catering for those who may be sixth form students, or who are in the early stages of a university or conservatoire course. Grade VII-VIII is the gateway. The Oundle tutors will point you towards excitingly varied approaches for different musical styles: period fingering, articulation, organ management, improvisation are all on the menu. Benefit from this course to move ahead into more challenging tracts of organ literature.

There will be ready access to the Oundle instruments, complemented by awaydays to Cambridge and elsewhere. For those who are church organists there will also be help with accompaniment and choral training.

## Advanced Academy (AA)

typical age range 20 - 24

Designed for those who hope to emerge into a professional career as an organist. Many students from the UK and abroad have discovered this inspiring course to be the threshold to recital engagements and further study opportunities in this country.

Each day (three of which will be spent resident at Queen's College, Cambridge) you will focus upon a particular musical area, coached in tiny groups by one key tutor. You will receive personally tailored advice, and access to many excellent organs around Oundle and in Cambridge.

Some of the most prestigious recital awards are reserved for AA students.

POS will take place from 23rd to 27th July, in CAMBRIDGE.

### Prospective Organ Scholars (POS)

typical age range 15 - 18

New for 2002 is an extensively remodelled 'Oundle' summer school for Prospective Organ Scholars, taking place in Cambridge. This year thirty students will have the chance to 'be' organ scholars in Cambridge college chapels.

Never has there been a greater number of amazing opportunities for young organists to enter the profession through the traditional 'apprenticeship' route: an organ scholarship.
