

(Alternatively, you may be able to persuade your school, church or local organists' association to contribute towards the cost.)

ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation is at Fletton House, Oundle, a comfortable and wellequipped boarding house close to Oundle School Chapel. The facilities include a games room. Pastoral care is provided by experienced staff.

TIMETABLE

The course begins at 10.30am on the Friday. During the weekend, students will enjoy seven inspiring teaching sessions, playing the fine organs in and around Oundle. A special feature will be the trip to Cambridge to hear Robert Quinney give a recital on the recently restored organ in St Catharine's College Chapel, preceded by an 'organ crawl' to try out the organs in other college chapels. The course will end on Sunday 13 April with an informal concert given by the students themselves, playing the splendid three-manual Frobenius organ in Oundle School Chapel. The concert starts at 2.30pm; parents and friends are warmly invited (free admission). Tea and cakes at about 3.45pm bring the weekend to a close.

LOCATION

Oundle is a very pleasant old market town on the A605, 12 miles west of Peterborough. Access by road is from the A1M or A14. By train, Peterborough is on the main GNER east coast line (also served by cheaper WAGN trains from London); we will meet students at Peterborough station if you wish.


