

In 2002 Isabel Jones and Rosalind Stoddart embarked on a period of research and development; in April this year they collaborated on *Stabat Mater* by Scarlatti, a dance/voice performance commissioned by Lincoln Cathedral for Isabel Jones's company, Salamanda Tandem.

Light and Movement was commissioned for Oundle International Festival 2003 to music composed by Sir John Tavener, Nipson, in which the concept of inner silence is present throughout.

Isabel is a dancer, choreographer, composer and singer. She has directed and choreographed several full-length touring performances and numerous smaller works, films, installations and recordings. This year Isabel has been working as co-composer on a commission by Opera North. In 1996 she received an award for her work with Butoh Dance, which launched her solo dance career. She went on to perform in Paris, Germany, Australia and throughout the UK.

Rosalind is a visual artist who works with sculpture and printmaking; she is also artistic director of Fermynwoods Contemporary Art. She has exhibited widely in this country and abroad. Her work is in both public and private collections including HSBC Bank, Nordea Bank Stockholm, Microsoft, Bass Management Centre Nottingham, New Hall Cambridge University and Peterborough Museum and Art Gallery.
