Armonico Consort is just one of three outstanding choral ensembles at Oundle this year: the girl choristers and lay clerks of Salisbury Cathedral bring reassuringly Anglican repertoire, whilst young voices from Cambridge recreate the splendour of the Renaissance Roman liturgy in a lunchtime recital at historic Fotheringhay; two Tudor organs will be in residence in Fotheringhay Church throughout the summer.

As ever our wind players include distinguished organists, playing superb instruments in and around Oundle. Our organ buff's ticket will appeal to the many who support year by year the special profile Oundle always accords to organists, both famous and aspiring.
