# The Festival is 21 this year!

To celebrate our anniversary we bring you an exciting programme to contrast the passionate inspiration of Scandinavia and Finland with the sunshine and élan of midsummer nights in warmer climes, with an international array of brilliant artists from north and south.

The iconic Swedish Abba sound lives on as we invite you to relive the seventies with Björn Again; so dig out your blonde wigs and flares - and party!

Amongst the superb classical musicians joining us for the first time are the astonishing young Finnish pianist Juho Pohjonen playing his first ever recital in England, and the premier league Vertavo Quartet from Norway, playing Sibelius and Grieg. A specially commissioned exhibition of prints from Sweden provides context.

Guests from Italy include artists-in-residence Seicento, playing renaissance and baroque ensemble music (mostly at twilight), and the Gomalan Brass Quintet whose sumptuous sounds will echo around Fotheringhay Church to the strains of Verdi and Puccini. Vivaldi's Gloria at the Festival Eucharist and Bach's Italian Concerto for harpsichord played by Katerina Chroboková further develop the sunshine.

But for a scorcher of an opener, join us with Rafael and Friends; this thrilling and original guitarist combines the soul of the gypsy with the flash of flamenco and the risks of jazz! And at the end of the week, Orchestra of St John's, joined by soprano Rita Cullis, unites the elements in a programme framed by Mendelssohn's Hebrides Overture and Italian Symphony.

Oundle for Organists (the new name to encompass our summer schools for young organists in Oundle, Oxford and Cambridge) contributes a constellation of organist stars who between them will play all the major works for organ written by Mozart – and the Frobenius organ, itself a northern light of some magnitude, celebrates its own 21st birthday in a recital by USA virtuoso David Higgs.
