The historic university city of Cambridge, with its beautiful college buildings lining the river Cam, provides an inspiring backdrop for a week of very special consequence. Excellent organs, historic, romantic and neo-classical, are found in the college chapels, all within walking distance of each other.

Each day students will focus upon a particular musical area, coached in tiny groups by one key tutor. They will have access to numerous superb organs, in classes and for individual practice.

The course will feature a composite recital to which influential figures in the UK organ world will be invited. Expert appraisal, both realistic and encouraging in tone, is offered to all. Many students from the UK and overseas have found Oundle's Advanced Academy to be the gateway to recital engagements in the UK and to further prestigious study opportunities abroad.

All students receive books, scores and magazine subscriptions, thanks to the generosity of sponsors and individual supporters.


Cambridge
