

and rhythms coming from the US; a vital influence since most foreign music had been officially forbidden by the Italian Fascist regime.

After the war, Buscaglione returned to Turin and formed his own group, the Asternovas. In the meantime he was gradually creating his public character, inspired by Clark Gable and Mickey Spillane's gangsters. Buscaglione died unexpectedly at 40: he was killed in a car accident, at the wheel of his pink Thunderbird.

In his early professional career, Lew Pollack was a singer and pianist in vaudeville acts and began writing theme music for silent films including 'What Price Glory' and 'Seventh Heaven', and later full scores for sound films including 'Rebecca of Sunnybrook Farm' and 'Captain January'.
