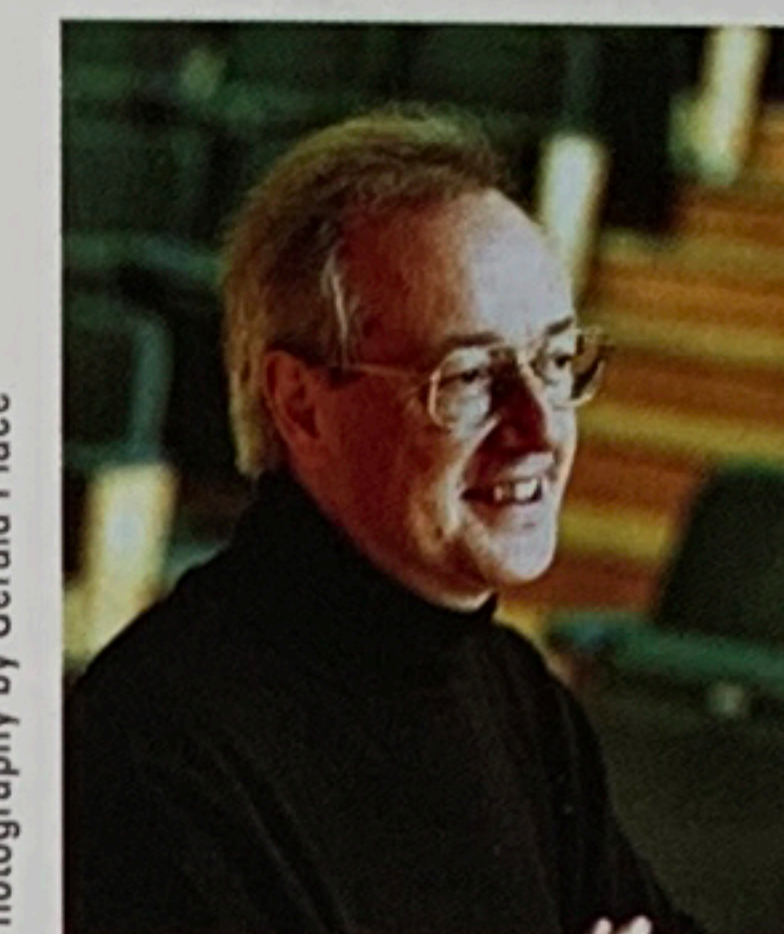

refreshing this great tradition of
Christmas music with compositions
from the foremost composers of our
own day. In March 2005, Stephen
Cleobury instigated the first Easter
Festival of Music at King's, at which
he conducted concerts with the
Chapel Choir and the Academy of
Ancient Music, broadcast by the BBC.

He has premiered many works with the

BBC Singers, notably Giles Swayne's *Havoc* at the Royal Albert Hall
at the Proms with the Endymion Ensemble. Last year he gave the
British premiere of Harrison Birtwistle's *Ring Dance of the
Nazarene* with the same forces.

The Choir of King's College, Cambridge owes its existence to King
Henry VI who, in founding the College in 1441, envisaged the daily
singing of services in his magnificent chapel, one of the jewels
of Britain's cultural and architectural heritage. As the pre-eminent
representative of the great British church music tradition, the
Choir retains this raison d'être; daily choral services are an
important part of the lives of the sixteen choristers, fourteen choral
scholars and two organ scholars who study in the College itself.

Today's Choir derives its worldwide fame and reputation from
the annual broadcast of the Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols,
which, thanks to the BBC and the American broadcasting station,
Minnesota Public Radio, is heard on radio by millions all over the
world. It is also famous for its international touring programme.
In recent seasons the Choir has travelled to the USA and Canada,
South Africa, Australia and throughout Asia Pacific, and frequently
to Europe. Summer 2005 saw the Choir performing at Germany's
Rheinvokal Festival, Turin's Settembre Musicale and as part of
Flanders Festival in Brussels. Later this year the Choir will also
be performing at the Stuttgart and Istanbul Festivals and the
Festival Portico de Semana at Salamanca in Spain.

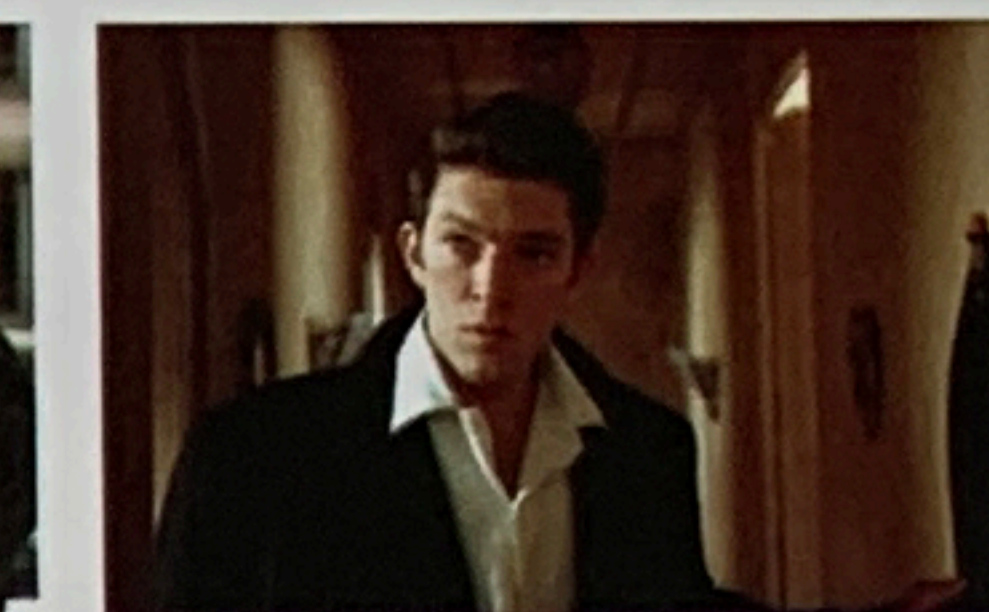
