King's Chamber Orchestra

Founded in 1985 by Gerard Le Feuvre, the King's Chamber Orchestra performs many times throughout the year in the UK and occasionally abroad. The orchestra's first concerts were given in support of the Christian charity Youth With a Mission, and it still regularly performs in aid of various charities. KCO's members are

distinguished musicians whom Gerard has gathered together to win over new audiences with their enthusiasm and humour.

Gerard Le Feuvre, Cellist/Director

Gerard was born in Jersey in 1962; his musical inspiration as a child came from Jacqueline Du Pré, to whom he is distantly related. By his mid teens Gerard had won two national awards as an outstanding young British cellist and went on to win

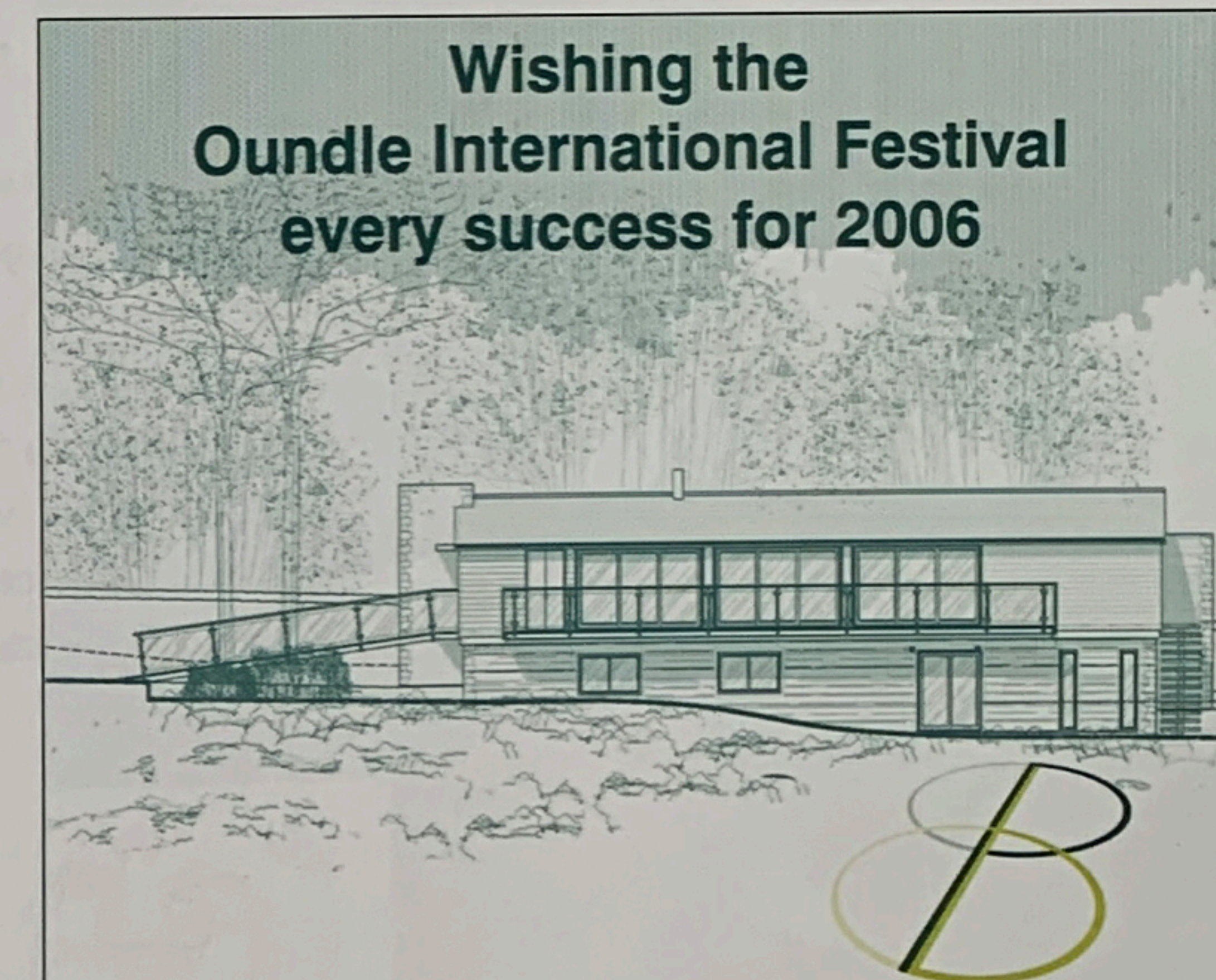
scholarships to the Royal Academy of Music and further studies in Canada, Finland, Switzerland and the USA. Over the last 20 years Gerard has given over 500 recitals, mostly with the British pianist Nigel Clayton, and has performed concertos in the UK, Germany, Scandinavia and in the USA. In 2000 the Royal Academy of Music awarded Gerard the title of Associate in honour of his 'outstanding achievements in the music profession'.

John Kane, Orchestra Leader

John was awarded a scholarship to study music at the Royal Northern College of Music, gaining prizes for solo and chamber performance. He has been a member of the Bournemouth Sinfonietta and played with many of the country's finest ensembles. He is currently Associate Leader of the English String Orchestra and Leader of the Concertante of London.
