Music by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756-1791) in celebration of the 250th anniversary of the year of his birth

Missa Brevis in F, K192

Written in 1774 when Mozart was still only 18 years old, this work is scored for string orchestra with organ continuo, four soloists and four-part chorus. Interestingly, a melodic figure used in the Credo is to reappear again at the end of the composer's life in the finale of his Jupiter Symphony.

Ave Verum Corpus, K618

Mozart's wrote this simple yet delightful motet on 17 June 1791 in Baden for the local schoolmaster and choir director. Anton Stoll had reserved rooms at the spa for Mozart's wife Constanza, who was expecting their sixth child, and Mozart penned the work for him in return for the favour. The setting is of an anonymous 14th century Latin text from the Abbey of Reichenau: 'Hail, true body, born of the virgin of Mary'.

YOUNG ORGANISTS' PLATFORM CONCERT

2.30pm Oundle School Chapel

Oundle for Organists, presented in partnership with the Royal College of Organists, is recognised as the UK's leading movement to train young organists. Summer schools for young organists have been offered alongside Oundle International Festival (OIF) since OIF's inception in 1985; now, whilst key Oundle programmes are still based in Oundle, the movement is increasingly 'on wheels',

offering summer schools in Cambridge and day events around the country. Furthermore, an 'Oundle' programme for advanced students is planned for Toulouse later this year, during the October *Toulouse les orgues* Festival.

Today there is the opportunity to hear an exciting composite recital given by teenage students attending the *Exploring New Repertoire* and *Style & Technique* streams here at Oundle. They have been tutored by Anne Page, Erwan le Prado, Henry Fairs, Bine Bryndorf and Geoffrey Webber (all contributing recitals) and by James Vivian and Simon Williams (see page 64).

Last week *Advanced Academy* took place in Cambridge, and next week (25th to 30th July) *Prospective Organ Scholars* will undertake their training programme, also in Cambridge, where they will live the life of an organ scholar for a few days.
