We offer up to twenty places for conservatoire-level organists from around the world to enjoy coaching and personallytailored advice from a premier-league faculty. Many students from the UK and overseas have found Advanced Academy as the gateway to further exciting study opportunities abroad.

Each day students will focus upon a particular musical area, coached in small groups by one key tutor. They will also enjoy access to the numerous College Chapel organs for individual practice.

Cambridge

is an historic and famous university city; its beautiful college buildings lining the river Cam provide an inspiring backdrop. Cambridge is also a paradise for organists with many splendid instruments all within walking distance. Some reflect 17th and 18th century ideals, others offer a huge romantic palette, whilst some adopt a neo-classical style. The instruments feature the work of builders such as Harrison, von Beckerath, Mander, Klais, Létorneau, Metzler, Frobenius, St Martin, Goetze and Gwynn, and Flentrop.

Accommodation

Students and tutors will be accommodated in single rooms at St Catharine's College, in the centre of Cambridge. All meals will be taken in College.

Recital awards

The course will feature a composite recital. All Oundle for Organists courses are non-competitive but the tutors assess standard, progress and potential. Every year we offer students the chance to perform at over sixty prominent venues in the UK. Most Advanced Academy students are sent on

mini-recital tours to cathedrals, concert halls and Oxbridge colleges in the season following their course. Travel expenses (within the UK) are paid as a minimum remuneration. Students also receive books, scores and magazine subscriptions, thanks to generous sponsors.

- Complete and return the Application Form by 20 April 2006 enclosing a brief reference from your teacher or course director. We will write to you by 28 April to let you know if we can offer you a place. Online applications will be possible from 1 January 2005.
- The all-inclusive fee for the course is £500 but send no money with your application; the deposit is due 8 May and the balance is due 15 June.
- If you need to apply for a bursary, tick the box on the Application Form, and enclose a letter from yourself/your parent/teacher/pastoral tutor to outline your situation.
