With great humour and originality the King's Chamber Orchestra brings to Oundle their latest family programme, featuring classical highlights from around the world, from the frozen North to the Mediterranean.

Formed in 1985 by cellist Gerard Le Feuvre, and ranging in size from nine to sixty players, King's Chamber Orchestra is a professional orchestra performing all year round in London, the Home Counties, and occasionally abroad. It is renowned as much for its humour and its pioneering improvisations as for its conventional repertoire. It began life as a symphony orchestra,

but regular concerts as a chamber orchestra began in the 1990s to support the Christian charitable work of Youth With A Mission. Today the number of concerts has expanded from its original handful to twenty to thirty a year. The KCO's members are distinguished musicians and friends whom Gerard has gathered together while freelancing with some of the finest orchestras in the country, and who share an interest in breaking down traditional barriers in order to reach a new generation.

Gerard Le Feuvre was born in Jersey in the Channel Islands in 1962. As a teenager he won scholarships to the Royal Academy of Music, the Banff School of Performing Arts (Canada), and the Sibelius Academy (Finland). Over the last 20 years Gerard has given over 500 recitals, and has performed concertos in the UK, Germany, Scandinavia, and in the USA. He has had several works written for him and is an active composer himself. As a freelancer, Gerard plays principal cello with the English Chamber Orchestra, the English Sinfonia, the Royal Ballet Sinfonia and the New Queen's Hall Orchestra. In 2000, the Royal Academy of Music awarded Gerard the title of Associate in honour of his outstanding achievements in the music profession.

After graduating from the Royal College of Music, Jeremy Sampson subsequently spent two years as violinist-in-residence at Oundle School, during which time he became involved with Oundle International Festival, returning to London to freelance with the Orchestra of St. John's, City of London Sinfonia, London Mozart Players and Corelli Strings. Jeremy has played with the Academy of St. Martin's-in-the-Fields and the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, and performed in every major concert hall in the UK.

In collaboration with Cleghorn-Waring Pumps Jeremy has created an education project which not only teaches the science of pump technology but uses this technology to build an instrument that creates music. The WOOFYT (Wooden One-octave Organ For Young Technologists) was judged by Arts & Business to be 'The most innovative business and arts project 2002-2006'.
