Cambridge

is an historic and famous university city; its
beautiful college buildings lining the river Cam
provide an inspiring backdrop. Cambridge also
offers organists many splendid instruments, all
within walking distance. Some reflect 17th and
18th century ideals, others offer a huge romantic
palette, whilst some adopt a neo-classical style.
The instruments feature the work of builders
such as Harrison, von Beckerath, Mander, Klais,
Létourneau, Lund, Metzler, Frobenius, St Martin,
Goetze & Gwynn, and Flentrop.

Accommodation

Students, tutors and observers will be accommodated in single rooms at St Catharine's College, in the centre of Cambridge. All meals will be taken in College.

Recital awards

The course will feature a composite student recital and tutors' celebrity recitals. Oundle for Organists courses are non-competitive but tutors assess standard, progress and potential. Every year we offer students the chance to perform at prominent venues in the UK: most Advanced Academy students are sent on mini-recital tours to cathedrals, concert halls and Oxbridge colleges in the season following

their course. Travel expenses (within the UK) are paid as minimum remuneration. Students also receive books, scores and magazine subscriptions, thanks to generous sponsors.

TO APPLY

- Complete and return Application Form by 30 April 2007 enclosing a brief reference from your teacher or course director. We will write to you by 7 May to let you know if we can offer you a place. Online applications will be possible from 15 January 2007.
- The all-inclusive fee for the course is £525 but send no money with your application; the deposit (£175) is due 21 May and the balance is due 18 June.
- If you need to apply for a bursary, tick the box on the Application Form, and enclose a letter from yourself/your parent/teacher/pastoral tutor to outline your situation.


