THE **BOOTLEG**
BEATLES

Formed from the West End cast of the Broadway musical 'Beatlemania', The Bootleg Beatles' career began in 1980, with all-night college balls. In 1995 Oasis asked them to be the support act for their record-breaking Earl's Court shows, and the following summer they joined Oasis again for their massive outdoor events in Loch Lomond, Cork and Knebworth. These gigs heralded the Bootleg Beatles' breakthrough to a new contemporary audience, something unheard of for a 'tribute' act. Since becoming regulars on the festival circuit, The Bootlegs have played Wembley with Rod Stewart and Elton John, shared the bill with The Corrs, David Bowie and Iggy Pop and filled Tokyo's Budokan Hall in their own right. Of all the venues they have played perhaps none was more auspicious than their appearance on the rooftop of the Apple Building in London. On the freezing morning of 30 January 1999 the BBs commemorated the Fab Four's farewell gig exactly thirty years before; the event was covered by news channels across the globe.

Legendary 1960s pop group Manfred Mann had fifteen UK Top 20 singles, three of them number ones; after The Beatles and The Animals they were the third band in the history of English rock to reach a number one position in America. Lead singer Paul Jones left the group in 1966, to be replaced by Mike D'Abo, and the band eventually split up in 1969. In 1991 Paul and Mike joined two other original members, Mike Hugg and Tom McGuinness, to form The Manfreds, and along with talented new members have a busy touring and recording schedule, keeping alive the golden age of British popular music.

Oundle's own rock and roll band pride themselves on their close-harmony singing. They recorded their first album, 'It's Never Too Late', in 2005.

They have developed from three acoustic instruments to today's electric rock 'n roll band specialising in 60s music that everyone is familar with. In the 60s Roger Parsell toured with the likes of The Nashville Teens and, from America, The Turtles and many others.

During that same period 'Deli' Dave Findley toured with P J Proby, The Searchers and Gene Vincent. He recorded with the legendary record producer, Joe Meek and shared a Midlands TV show with The Swinging Blue Jeans.

Also in the 60s, Tony Bell appeared in his front room at home in front of the mirror with a hair brush dreaming of stardom. . . he's still waiting and still looking in the mirror.
