

The Queen of Sheba arrives - and departs - to frame this multi-branched celebration of Handel's music, and its resonance in pieces by other composers for the organ. Handel (d.1759) features in our musical celebrations this year and Gerard's entertaining programme includes Guilmant's March on Handel's *Lift up your heads*, Grainger's *Handel in the Strand*, and new pieces by Paul Ayres and Thomas Neal - alongside Voluntary on a *Flight of Angels*, and Organ Concerto in D minor (Op. 7 no 4) by Britain's own nationalised institution, the great GFH.

Gerard, recently appointed Director of Music at Methodist Central Hall, Westminster, is one of the nimblest players in the business - and this recital should be fun!

## TOUR OF ROCKINGHAM CASTLE


