## Oundle International Festival 25th Anniversary Appeal Hon. President Charles Bush

Oundle International Festival, or 'Organ Week' as it was then frequently called, was founded in 1985 with the twin aims of providing excellence in training for young and talented organists, and high-quality professional music concerts, all of which happened during one crazy week in July. In essence those twin themes are still at the very heart of Oundle International Festival, but we have developed and spread our wings in what has become a multi-faceted and wide-reaching organisation.

We now draw thousands to Oundle every July for the Festival, and in Spring and Autumn we run Music in Quiet Places, which promotes recitals in local villages. Meanwhile, the one week organ summer school has become Oundle for Organists, a year-round series of courses for players of all ages. Ninety-three per cent of this year's Cambridge organ scholarships were awarded to our students, and several former pupils have gone on to become international celebrities.

We've come a long way since those early days, but our excitement for music has not diminished, and one venture close to our hearts is community opera. This year's production of The Cunning Little Vixen by Janáček will involve up to 150 volunteer participants as well as professional opera singers and musicians, and embrace one of our main aims: to bring the pleasure of classical music to as wide a section of people as possible.

So what of the future? We intend to develop an educational outreach programme to take music into schools and old people's homes, take the organ courses further afield, form a Festival Choir and Youth Choir and make community opera a biennial event. But the arts are traditionally underfunded in this country, and we constantly struggle to achieve the financial support we need, which is why we are asking for your help! To ensure our plans can become realities, we are aiming to raise £25,000 to celebrate this, our 25th anniversary.

Classical music should be accessible to everyone, and year by year this is what we work to achieve. We look forward to welcoming you warmly to all aspects of our Festival and very much hope you will respond generously to our appeal.
